EMILY DISFIB FEEDER BUCKET

French firm Emily launched a novel take on a feeder bucket, which uses a slat and chain moving floor rather than an auger.

Called the Disfib, short for discharge fibre, it is claimed to be better abled at handling longer material such as un-chopped or long chopped silage.

In addition to the moving floor, is a rotary agitator, which mulches crop to an extent and forces feed out of the bucket. This can be up to 3.4cu.m of feed in as little as 20 seconds says the manufacturer. Hydraulic flow rate requirement is 40l/min.

Bucket capacities are currently 1.8, 2.6 and 3.4cu.m, with more models to follow.

Optional grab attachments are available including a feed rotor for cutting the face of a silage clamp, for example.

Available now, the machine retails from 9,000 Euros.
